Directorate: Conservation **Location:** Cambodia – based in Phnom Penh with

extended periods in the field

Reporting to: Head of Conservation & Development

Main function of post: To implement WWT's wetland conservation programme in Cambodia, including; ecohydrological research, community-based natural resource management, field staff coordination, and programme administration. Much of the work will centre upon, but will not be limited to, WWT's two focal sites in the region, Boeung Prek Lapouv (BPL) and Anlung Pring (AP) Protected Landscapes. A wider remit of the position will be to represent WWT at national and regional levels, ensuring our strategic priorities are promoted and organizational obligations are met.

Supervisory responsibilities: Field teams, including Technical Advisors/Officers, researchers, volunteers and students, as well as assisting with the oversight of partner field staff as and when appropriate.

Hours worked: 37 ½ hours per week, Full Time

Working pattern: Monday-Friday with flexibility required during fieldwork.

Main duties of the post

- To implement a review of ecological and ecosystem service value of key wetland sites in the Cambodian Lower Mekong Delta and coordinate research into the optimal ecohydrological states of BPL and AP Protected Landscapes.
- 2. To support the re-zoning and management planning processes for BPL and AP Protected Landscapes, ensuring priority habitats and community sustainable use rights are acknowledged and integrated.
- To work with the 'Ministry of Environment' and 'BirdLife International Cambodia Programme', to enhance protection and international recognition of key wetland sites in the Cambodian Lower Mekong Delta.

4. To manage specialist partnerships that support the financial viability of long-term sustainable livelihood programmes in and around AP and BPL. Current projects include sustainable rice production, community fisheries management and ecotourism.

5. To identify and seize upon opportunities for the WWT Cambodia Programme to influence wise use of wetlands within the Cambodian Lower Mekong Delta (CLMD).

6. To support local partners to develop and implement engaging environmental education and awareness campaigns.

7. To keep abreast of environmental and socio-economic issues and trends relating to sustainable wetland management in Cambodia and the wider Indo-Burma Region.

8. To identify and support external consultants to refine WWT Cambodia's organisational policies and positions to ensure the organisation complies with legal requirements.

9. To support operational and financial administrative systems which facilitate the successful delivery and growth of WWT's Cambodia Programme.

10. To represent WWT externally as appropriate, including with partners and other key stakeholders in Cambodia.

11. To contribute to internal and external reporting needs as required.

12. To deliver, or contribute to the delivery of, internal or external training and support sessions as required.

13. To organise or contribute to the organisation of seminars, conferences and other events as required.

In addition to the duties and responsibilities listed, the post holder is required to perform any other reasonable duties that may be assigned by the supervisor shown above, as appropriate for the delivery of project or wider objectives.
