Main function of post: To assist with the delivery of all avicultural aspects of the headstarting

programme for the Dartmoor Curlew Recovery Project

Supervisory responsibilities: Volunteers.

Main duties of the post

- To maintain indoor facilities and their associated equipment by carrying out daily cleaning and disinfection to the agreed standards and reporting any issues as required.
- To maintain the outdoor aviaries and other outdoor areas by carrying out repairs as well as cutting, moving and other control of vegetation as agreed and reporting any issues as required.
- To uphold rigorous biosecurity standards to ensure the health and safety of humans, eggs and birds, at all times.
- To assist with the feeding and monitoring of curlew chicks in accordance with strict protocols.
- To assist with activities related to the incubation of curlew eggs as required, under the supervision of WWT aviculturists.
- To assist with predator control activities in accordance with protocols and government guidelines.
- To rigorously collect and record data on eggs and chicks as well as environmental conditions and husbandry activities using paper and electronic record-keeping systems.

In addition to the duties and responsibilities listed, the post holder is required to perform any other reasonable duties that may be assigned by the supervisor shown above, from time to time.

1. Qualifications

Essential:

- Good basic education to a minimum of A Level standard or equivalent.
- Full UK driving license.

Desirable:

- Certificates in the safe use of equipment and materials relating to vegetation management, e.g. the use of brushcutters, strimmers and mowers.
- BSc in a biological or related discipline.
- Animal care and management qualifications.
- Four wheel drive certification.

- Experience of working on ex situ species conservation programmes.
